



How to Lead a Child to Christ

Steps on how to lead a child to Christ



Show him his **NEED** of salvation; that all persons are not going to heaven; that no one in himself is good enough to go. (Romans 3:23; Revelation 21:27; John 8:21,24)



Show him the **WAY** of salvation. It is by grace a free gift because the Lord Jesus took our place on the cross and rose from the dead. (Ephesians 2:8; 1 Corinthians 15:3,4)



Lead him to **RECEIVE** the gift of salvation, even Jesus Christ as Savior (John 1:12). Encourage him to pray (talk with the Lord Jesus) in his own words. In some cases, you may feel led to assist the child in prayer. Here is a sample prayer to use:

"Dear Lord Jesus, I know that You died for my sins. I receive You now as my Savior from sin. Amen."



Show him that he now has salvation. (John 3:36; Acts 13:38)



Lead him to **CONFESS** Christ (Matthew 10:32). This confession should be made to you, other workers, later to his friends, and as circumstances permit, in a public church service.

Some Thoughts

Verses and thoughts to keep in mind when working with children

- You are to provide each child with the opportunity to accept Christ as Savior and to grow into Christ-centered maturity.

- "Him we proclaim...instructing every individual in the whole range of wisdom, so that we may present every person complete in Christ. And for this I toil..." (Colossians 1:28,29)



- "Glory, honor, and peace, to every man that worketh good..." (Romans 2:10)

- You will be rewarded when some of your group accept Christ or are filled with the Holy Spirit.

- You will be rewarded by seeing spiritual growth in your children.

- You will be rewarded by seeing children's new and renewed

commitments to God.

- You will be rewarded by building new relationships with children and seeing them respond to you as a leader.

Since you are doing your work as unto the Lord, the **REAL REWARDS** will come from Him!

- You will hear the voice of God saying: "Inasmuch as ye have done it unto the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me." (Matthew 25:40)

A Basic Plan of Salvation

Romans 3:23—All people are sinners.

Romans 5:8—Christ died to save us.

Romans 6:23—Sin earns death, but God wants to give eternal life.

Romans 10:9,10—A person must believe (trust) in Christ and confess Him as Savior in order to be saved.

Romans 10:13—This gift of salvation is claimed through prayer.

1 John 2:3,4—Proof of salvation is obedience to Christ's command.

• You will rejoice in Matthew 10:42: “And whosoever shall give to drink unto one of these little ones a cup of cold water only in

the name of a disciple, verily I say unto you, he shall in no wise lose his reward.”

• You may look forward to hear-

ing the Divine Master say, “Well done, thou good and faithful servant.”
