

## **Recipe for Bible Learning**

#### Combine equal parts learning and fun. Mix well.

When kids are having fun while learning it makes the content stick much better in their minds. Help ease the stress for first-time quizzers by not putting them in a position where they feel pressured to know it all too soon. If they are close to the right answer, celebrate with them, and then help them learn the parts that were missed. Keep the kids smiling and laughing!

## **Seven Steps of Success**

Beginning from day one, pair Bible learning with fun.

**1. Find a leader:** Perhaps that's you! Depending on the number of kids, you might need a few more.

**2. Invite kids:** Four to six kids is best for a team, but a team can begin with just two or three and grow from there.

**3.** Order supplies: It's a good idea to get a *Bible Fact-Pak Study Guide* for every kid. These are the questions and answers that JBQ uses and will allow kids to learn at home.

4. Keep it fun! Beginning from day one, pair Bible learning with fun. If kids are having fun, they will want to study more. To do this, try playing games like Quiz Tac Toe or JBQ Baseball to get the kids familiar with the material without sitting at the buzzers yet. (Buzzers can be intimidating to a new kid)

**5. Coordinate calendars:** Select a time to meet that works for families and the church. This can be done before or after service, or even during a Sunday School class time. JBQ works

best when it meets during a time when kids are going to be at church already.

**6. Start slow:** Pick twenty questions for the kids to become confident with. From there, you can expand. Don't go too fast though; you want the kids to master the material.

7. Encourage, encourage, encourage: Kids need to hear you say they are doing a good job, even if they only get one question right. Praise them a ton. They are hungry to earn your approval and will seek to do more.
